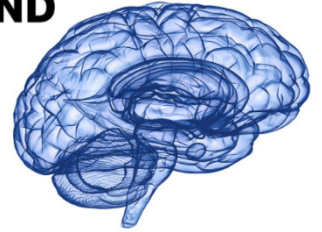

## Presentation Guidelines

Congratulations on your selection as a presenter for the 2022 Aus & NZ MND Research Symposium to be held on April 28<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> 2022. Please use this document as a guide when preparing your presentation.

### Platform presentations

Please prepare your talk using Microsoft PowerPoint. Information for uploading talks prior to the meeting will be provided closer to the meeting. Presentations will be followed by a Q&A session during which all presenters will be given an opportunity to address questions from the audience. To facilitate discussion, we ask that you please limit your presentation to 10-12 minutes.

### Rapid Research presentations

Presenters are asked to prepare a 5 minute talk in addition to a poster presentation. The 5 minute limit will be strictly enforced and the Chair will intervene if talks run longer than their allocated time. Speakers are asked to prepare talks using Microsoft PowerPoint and are asked to structure their talks around 5 slides; where possible, include a title, introduction, methods, results and discussion slide. Information for uploading talks prior to the meeting will be provided closer to the meeting. Please see guidelines below for poster design.

### Poster presentations

Posters are to be pinned to poster boards on day 1 of the meeting. Instructions for pinning will be provided at the time of registration, from staff overseeing the registration desk. There will be a special catered poster session on the evening of day 1 of the symposium at 5pm (April 28<sup>th</sup>). We ask that posters please remain in place for the duration of the meeting, and where possible, for the MND Connect.

*Design:* While posters can be presented in landscape or portrait format, please limit the design of your poster to no more than **1m wide** and **1.2m tall**. Posters outside of these parameters will not fit poster boards.
